This slow Cuban bolero was written in 1941 by the Cuban composer and musician Ernesto Duarte Brito. It was made famous by the Cuban singer Beny Moreé and the Ernesto Duarte orchestra in 1953. The lyrics express the singer's confusion of how it all happened and his happiness that love has brought them together.

Performance notes: The Cuban bolero is a slow dance in 4/4 time. You must emphasize beats 1, 2, 3 and 4 consistently throughout the piece. The vibrato in measures 14 and 22 is easily achieved by vibrating your left leg into the bottom of the bellows. Like love, dynamics are important!
