

You And The Night And The Music

This smoldering tango first appeared in the 1934 musical Revenge with Music. Sadly, it was banned from radio broadcast due to the salacious lyrics in measures 7 to 8.

Performance notes: Be careful not to drag the triplets—you may need to practice this with a metronome. Counting in 2 (not 4!) will help keep the beat even. Speaking of triplets, don't play them where they aren't! For example, in measures 7 and 24 there are quarter note triplets followed by non-triplets.
